

Makos Review Lesson 70 - DAF 14B:
MALKUS FOR A TAMEI WHO ATE KODESH:

1. **Mishnah:** If a Tamei person eats Kodesh (or enters the Mikdash, he is lashed).
2. **Question:** We understand why a Tamei who enters the Mikdash is lashed (and is listed with transgressions of Kares):because....
 - The punishment is explicit - "Es Mishkan Hash-m Timei v'Nichresah";
 - The Lav (the warning for lashes) is explicit - "vV'Lo Yetam'u Es Machaneihem."
 - The Kares for eating Kodesh is explicit - "veha'Nefesh Asher Tochal... ha'Shlamim... v'Tum'aso Alav";
 - However, what is the warning against eating Kodesh?
3. **Answer #1 of Reish Lakish:** It is "b'Chol Kodesh Lo Siga."
4. **Answer #2 of R. Yochanan:** We learn from a Gezerah Shavah "Tum'aso-Tum'aso":
 - It says here "v'Tum'aso Alav", like it says (about a Tamei who enters the Mikdash) "Od Tum'aso Vo";
 - Just like there the Torah specifies warning and punishment, also regarding eating Kodesh.
